### A word from our Chair Kerri Rennie...

We have had a very busy year at Bedford Borough Parent Carer Forum (BBPCF). I would like to take this opportunity to thank all our members for their contributions. Your engagement supports the continuing, important work of the forum by keeping the needs of our families at the forefront of everything we do. Your feedback informs service providers and organisations, including Bedford Borough Council, Cambridgeshire Community Services and NHS Bedfordshire, Luton and Milton Keynes ICB.

This Annual Report (July 2024) provides information on BBPCF's work throughout the year. I hope you will take a few minutes to look at all the different ways we have actively represented the local SEND community.

In my role as BBPCF Chair, I have the opportunity to hear many different views and experiences, motivating me to seek further improvements in all areas of support for our SEND community. BBPCF aim to create a culture of participation and co-production with all stakeholders in Bedford Borough.

At the centre of this is the SEND community voice which must be heard to create real, effective improvement, which is why we now have more parent representatives than ever before, working out and about in the SEND community, and engaging with our parent carers.

With continued regard for the work the forum has done and a focus on what we have still to do, I ask you all to keep supporting your local forum, so that the 'Lived Experience' of families continues to improve both for now and for future generations.

### What is a Parent Carer Forum?

A parent carer forum is a group of parents and carers of children with a special educational need and/or disability, who work with local authorities, education settings, health providers and other providers to make sure the services they commission, plan and deliver meet the needs of SEND children and families in the local area.


The National Network of Parent Carer Forums (NNPCF) is composed of all the parent carer forums from across England. The NNPCF ensures that local parent carer forums are aware of national developments. It promotes opportunities for the voice of parent carers to influence at a national level.

The NNPCF works closely with the Department for Education, the Department of Health, and other partner organisations to improve outcomes for children and young people with disabilities or additional needs and their families.

BBPCF is a member of the Eastern Region of Parent Carer Forums (ERPCF). The Eastern Region consists of 11 forums covering Peterborough, Central Bedfordshire, Bedford Borough, Luton, Hertfordshire, Cambridge, Suffolk, Norfolk, Southend, Essex and Thurrock. Representatives from each forum meet 3 times a year and look at local and national developments, and there is an opportunity to feedback to the regional representative of the NNPCF and the Regional Adviser from Contact.

### Whatis Parent Carer Participation?

Parent carers can help highlight problems frequently experienced by families with SEND children. This knowledge is essential to practitioners to help them improve how children's services are planned and delivered so they better meet families' needs.

Parent carer participation is when parents and practitioners work together, recognising each other's expert knowledge, to make informeddecisions about children's services to ensure the best possible outcomes.

We are the voice for Parent Carers of children & young people 0-25 yrs with Special Educational Needs or Disabilities in Bedford Borough. BBPCF work alongside Bedford Borough Council (BBC), and the integrated Care Board (ICB) as a strategic partner representing our parent carers and working alongside services when key decisions are being made.



### How do we ensure we hear the voice of the parent carer?

We do this by giving parent carers the opportunity to participate in several ways such as get-togethers, training, social media, email, and focus groups, both online and face-to-face. This feedback can then

be used to co-produce and work at a strategic level with the Local Authority and the ICB.





Our regular events are always a great way to get feedback from parent carers on how services are working for them. We introduced SEND Forum Ten-minute bookable slots which allow parent carers to meet with professionals and service providers to discuss their individual cases. Over the past year, we've had the following services attending our SEND Forum bookable slots; Tim Long (Head of School Support Services) Chris Morris (Chief Officer-Education, SEND& School Infrastructure) Christian Weatherly (Principal Social Worker) Michelle Docking (SEND Team Manager), among others.

We also launched stronger beginnings which are drop-in sessions tailored to strongly signpost and support families that are just starting out in the complex world of SEND or those who have some concerns about their child's development.

### Our Annual Survey

BBPCF continues to run our annual survey. This is a tool we use to measure how well Bedford Borough Council and the Integrated Care Board (ICB) are meeting the needs of children and young people (age 0-25) with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities.

Our last survey was completed by over 650 parent carers which gave us a rich amount of data to share with the local authority and ICB, this feedback links directly into the SEND Strategy in Bedford Borough and informs our focus groups and priorities. From this we have created our annual outcomes report which we have shared on our website.

### What we do with your feedback...

We attend many boards and meetings within the Local Authority and the **ICB** to represent our parents' experiences and themes that we have picked up on through our get togethers, surveys and other events that we run throughout the year...

### What have we done with your feedback?

Following your feedback, the meetings and involvement we've had with the Local Authority and the Integrated Care Board we have done the following:

- We have started running ten-minute bookable slots with practitioners so that you can discuss your individual concerns.
- We have continued to run various activities and training to support parent carers wellbeing as you have told us this is important to you.
- An Outcomes report has been produced from our annual survey over which we received over 650 responses. This was shared with
- the Local Authority who delivered a partnership response.
   We work with the co-production lead for Cambridge Community Services to ensure there is clear co-production and your voices are heard.

We had representation from the Local Offer at several of our events so that they can hear your feedback regarding the content. Representation from SENDiass at our regular SEND Forum events so

- that you have an opportunity to seek information, advice and support from them.
- Worked with the Local Authority to support us to provide whole
  family inclusive events.
- We launched Stronger Beginnings sessions to support parent carers • who have just started investigating concerns around their child's

These are all positive developments that families have welcomed. However, families are still reporting issues in these main areas (taken from our Annual Survey 2022):

1.Children with EHCPs in mainstream schools show significantly worse scores than those in special schools.

2.The older children and young people get, the lower their average scores

3.Parents of Children and Young People with EHCPs were significantly more worried about their ability to be independent

4.Many familie issue

#### **Bedford Borough's Co-production Charter**

#### for children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities

#### What is co-production?

Co-production means working with people who use services as equal partners in design, development, commissioning, delivery and review of services to create better outcomes.

There are lots of reasons why we should co-produce:

#### This co-production charter lays out five principles that all parties will use to work together in the right way.

#### We listen to

#### everyone

We take the views of all parents, children, young people and practitioners seriously.

No-one should feel that they have to fight to be beard.

#### We empower people

We share the information everyone needs to know to take part in decision maki ng.

We provide support and advice where needed.

#### We co-produce from start to finish

We set the scope, agen da, key decisions and review progress together. Everyone is invited to the right meetings and made to feel welcome.

We do not put barriers in the way of good ideas and do not hide behind policy and protocol for reasons why things cannot be done.




